3. Define-with a **gel eyeliner** (it comes in a pot) instead of the usual pencil or shadow.
4. A **lip stain** in a China Doll tint to wear alone or under your favorite lipstick to make it last longer.
5. **Anything metallic** in eye shadow, cheek color, clothing, belt, handbag or earrings.

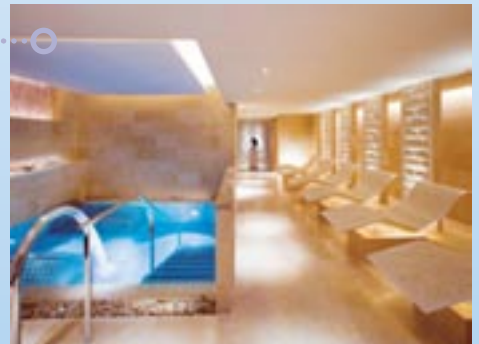

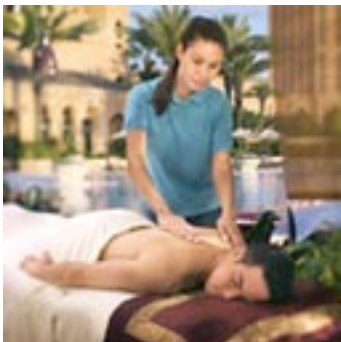
